Walk along the path next to the sea

2. One of these benches is in memory of the founder of the park, what's his name? _____

Follow the path round to the left, take the next right through the wooden gate. Stop at the pet graveyard.

3. The pet graveyard is here from when there used to be an animal hospital on site. Look on the gravestones, can you see a cartoon characters name? _____

Take the right hand path, towards the sea. Go past the wooden viewing hut.

4. Look out for somewhere to rest on your right – whos seat is it?

This man was an artist who is famous for paintings of wildlife and especially birds.

Keep going for quite a way, then take the next left.

On your right you can see a big field with small trees growing in it, it is called the Quillet and used to be used for horse races. The trees are 5-8 years old.



Keep going along this path. Untill you get to a building on your right.



5. This old building is called the pump house, can you find the pump? What colour is it? _____

On the building is an old grave – see if you can find any words that are spelt differently to how we spell them today.

6. What is the earliest year that is engraved onto the gravestone? _____

Keep going along the path

Along this path are quite a few lime trees, Can you spot them by their heart shaped leaves?

Turn right, go up the hill.

Keep going straight ahead till you get to another building.

8. This folly is the Betting stand, built in the early 1800's and used to watch the horse racing in the Quillet. How many arches are there on the building? _____
